⁸ FCP quick facts are based on new families for FSCs, but both new and ongoing clients for Home Visiting and SBYSP. DoW quick facts are based on new clients for DV Services, but both new and ongoing clients served for SAARC, Displaced Homemakers and Rape Prevention Education.


Children in Out-of-Home Placement: Annual Entries, Exits and Monthly Point in Time Children in Placement












CWS Referrals Assigned to Local Offices






Worker- Parent Visits & Sibling Visits








Any of these youth may be receiving services. These definitions are currently being reviewed to better understand how we capture DCF's work with this population. The goal of this ongoing work is to create three meaningful categories for 18-21 year olds 1) Youth in a formal out-of-home placement setting, 2) Youth that achieved permanency, and 3) Youth that never achieved permanency.






IAIU Caseload Report Statewide



IAIU Investigation Timeliness




IAIU Caseload Report by Region February 2024
