10	Please share brief information on your subdivisions overarching goals and values to provide context for this year's spending decisions	From July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024, the Local Advisory Committee on Alcoholism & Drug Abuse (LACADA), through it's Planning Subcommittee, met to review the results of the 2024 survey and focus groups and created a list of recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners. Top priorities identified were Availability/Access to services; transportation; cost of care; supportive services; and prevention/Education. The recommendations are to hire a navigator in the Department to help connect individuals to services with follow up contacts, as well as assist in providing information to the community about available services; work with local providers and schools to create summer camp opportunity for youth prevention efforts; work with schools to provide after school programming for prevention and education opportunities; work with the County transportation provider to increase evening and weekend services for individuals to access meetings, treatment and employment opportunities; and marketing campaign to increase awareness of services in the community. The Department is working with the Commissioners to finalize the budget for the recommendations to be put into action.
